CONFESSION OF FAITH: APOSTLES' CREED²

All: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell.³

The third day he rose again from the dead.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church,⁴ the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

² The Apostles' Creed is the oldest and simplest creed in the Christian church. Its earliest forms have been dated to around AD 200 when new converts were asked to profess it before joining the church. Christians have used it during worship for thousands of years to show our unity in the faith.

³ "He descended into hell" expresses Christ's "being buried, and continuing in the state of the dead, and under the power of death till the third day." See Westminster Larger Catechism 50.

⁴ The word "catholic" derives from the Greek word *katholikos*, which means universal. The catholic church is the universal church, which is invisible, consisting of all Christians in every church that have been, are, or shall be under Christ the Head. *See* Westminster Confession of Faith 25:1. The Apostles' Creed predates the church's division into the Western Roman Catholic and the Eastern Orthodox churches or the Reformation of the Western Church that came much later.

OLD TESTAMENT READING: SELECTIONS FROM JEREMIAH

19:14 Then Jeremiah came from Topheth, where the LORD had sent him to prophesy, and he stood in the court of the LORD's house and said to all the people: ¹⁵ "Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, behold, I am bringing upon this city and upon all its towns all the disaster that I have pronounced against it, because they have stiffened their neck, refusing to hear my words." ^{20:1} Now Pashhur the priest, the son of Immer, who was chief officer in the house of the LORD, heard Jeremiah prophesying these things. ² Then Pashhur beat Jeremiah the prophet, and put him in the stocks that were in the upper Benjamin Gate of the house of the LORD.

36:21 Then the king sent Jehudi to get the scroll, and he took it from the chamber of Elishama the secretary. And Jehudi read it to the king and all the officials who stood beside the king. ²² It was the ninth month, and the king was sitting in the winter house, and there was a fire burning in the fire pot before him. ²³ As Jehudi read three or four columns, the king would cut them off with a knife and throw them into the fire in the fire pot, until the entire scroll was consumed in the fire that was in the fire pot. ²⁴ **Yet neither the king nor any of his servants who heard all these words was afraid, nor did they tear their garments.**

38:1 Jeremiah was saying to all the people: ² "Thus says the LORD: He who stays in this city shall die by the sword, by famine, and by pestilence....This city shall surely be given into the hand of the army of the king of Babylon and be taken." ⁴ Then the officials said to the king, "Let this man be put to death...." ⁵ King Zedekiah said, "Behold, he is in your hands, for the king can do nothing against you." ⁶ So they took Jeremiah and cast him into the cistern of Malchiah, the king's son, which was in the court of the guard, letting Jeremiah down by ropes. And there was no water in the cistern, but only mud, and Jeremiah sank in the mud.



ASSURANCE OF PARDON: ROMANS 5:8–10



⁵ In our prayer of confession, we are honest with God, with ourselves, and with each other about who God is and who we are, confessing to Him that He is holy, righteous, just, and loving; and that we are not; yet, we are trusting in His mercy and grace available in Jesus Christ. We then have the joy of hearing God's Word say that He is faithful and just to forgive us of our sins when we confess (1 John 1:9). And we have the joy of responding in song.

Jesus Promises Persecution Luke 6:22–23, 26

I. Promise of Persecution (v.22)

Apostle Peter: "Beloved, do not be surprised at the **fiery trial** when it comes upon you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. ¹³ But **rejoice** insofar as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when **his glory is revealed**." 1 Peter 4:12–13

Apostle Paul:

- "Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted" 2 Tim 3:12
- "For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also **suffer for his sake**" Philippians 1:29

II. Promise of Joy (v.23a)

"Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name." Acts 5:41

Stephen: "Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." Acts 7:56

"About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them, and suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that...immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone's bonds were unfastened. Acts 16:25-26

"We rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not put us to shame, because **God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us**." Rom 5:3–5

III. Promise of Great Reward (v.23b)

Jehovah's Covenant Promise to Abraham & the Church: "I am your shield; your exceedingly great reward." Genesis 15:1 (NKJV)

"By faith **Abraham went to live in the land of promis**e, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God.

"For this <u>light</u> momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal <u>weight</u> of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal." 2 Cor 4:17–18
